Communication Platforms

- Free Conference Call (<u>freeconferencecall.com</u>)
 - o Robust free option available
 - o Pros
 - Capacity of up to 1,000 participants
 - Supports audio and video conferences
 - Access can be shared with anyone easily
 - Dial-in number for every account
 - Screensharing, recording, and chat options are easy to use
 - Host can mute participants if needed
 - Compatible with mobile devices
 - Step-by-step instructions available
 - o Cons
 - Some mobile carriers (e.g. T-Mobile) may charge a small fee to participants who dial in
 - No file attachment option
 - No HIPAA compliant option at present
- Google Meet (https://gsuite.google.com/products/meet/)
 - o Free for nonprofits as part of G Suite for Nonprofits
 - Includes access to all the apps of <u>G Suite Basic</u> such as Gmail, Drive, Calendar, and more, making it a robust remote work solution
 - o Pros
 - Capacity of up to 100 participants
 - Supports audio and video conferences
 - Access can be shared with people outside the organization
 - Dial-in number available if this feature is turned on
 - Screensharing and chat options are easy to use
 - Compatible with mobile devices
 - Training guide and cheat sheet available
 - Possible to establish HIPAA compliance after signing a BAA with Google
 - o Cons
 - Recording to save in Google Drive not available at the Basic account level



- Microsoft Teams (https://products.office.com/en-us/microsoft-teams/group-chat-software)
 - o Free for nonprofits as part of Office 365 Nonprofit Business Essentials
 - Includes access to Exchange for email, OneDrive and SharePoint for digital file storage/sharing, making it a robust remote work solution
 - Packages with additional features available at an additional cost
 - o Pros
 - Capacity of up to 10,000 participants
 - Supports audio and video conferences
 - Access can be shared with people outside of organization to some extent
 - Screensharing, recording, chat and file attachment options are easy to use
 - Option to mute others if needed
 - Compatible with mobile devices
 - Quick start guide and on demand video training available
 - Possible to establish HIPAA compliance after signing a BAA with Microsoft
 - o Cons
 - Does not offer a dial-in option
 - Allowing people with a gmail.com email address to access Teams is challenging
 - Extra steps required to include people outside of organization
- Zoom (https://zoom.us/)
 - o Free version available, but limits group meetings to 40 minutes
 - o Discounted premium plans available through <u>Tech Soup</u>
 - o Pros
 - Capacity starts at 100 participants, increases available with different plans
 - Supports audio and video conferences
 - Access can be shared with anyone easily
 - Dial-in number available for all meetings
 - Most robust set of features (multi-screensharing, recording, chat, raise hand, breakout groups, multiple view options, host controls, etc.)
 - Compatible with mobile devices
 - On demand video tutorials available
 - Possible to establish HIPAA compliance at cost of \$200/month
 - o Cons
 - Cost
 - Many privacy/security issues have been encountered in recent weeks
 - User interface a bit more complex because of wide variety of features
